

Tucker Arensberg Forms Medical Marijuana Practice Group

"The Medical Marijuana Act provides the framework," says Barry K. Nelson, Chair of the Medical Marijuana Practice Group, "but the Department of Health is responsible implementing and administering the Medical Marijuana program. The regulations will affect everything from how to obtain a permit to grow, process, and dispense Medical Marijuana, to how Medical Marijuana can be transported and stored, to where it can be dispensed, so we're tracking developments very closely."
